## **Naplan – Grade 3 and 5 Students**

Early next week parents of children in years 3 and 5 will receive information regarding the NAPLAN assessment, which will be taking place on Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> – Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> May at school. NAPLAN tests the sorts of skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life, such as reading, writing, spelling, grammar and numeracy. It is important to remember that NAPLAN is not about passing or failing, but about assessing learning progress. Please feel free to see me if you have any questions at all about the NAPLAN assessment program. Results for individual students will be sent home to families once they arrive at the school from VCAA. Our teachers have been working with students to ensure that they are prepared and confident for the Naplan assessment and I am sure that all students will demonstrate their personal best.

## **School Review**

In Term 2, Canadian Lead Primary School will be undertaking its self-evaluation in readiness for the School Review in term 3. This is something that occurs in all public schools once every 4 years. This process concludes with the school completing a Strategic Plan, which sets goals and targets for the coming 4 years. Each of our School Council and Staff Meetings throughout this term will feature discussions relating to the school review and I will be seeking input from our Junior School Council and Parents Association. It's an exciting time for the school to have the opportunity to review its progress of the last four years and develop strong and purposeful goals for continued improvement over the next four-year cycle. ## **Viral gastroenteritis fact sheet**

**Gastroenteritis is commonly caused by viral infections resulting in vomiting and diarrhoea. The viruses are easily spread from person to person. Thorough washing of hands with soap and running water are vital to prevent spread.**

### **What is viral gastroenteritis?**

Viral gastroenteritis is a common infection of the stomach and intestines that results in vomiting and diarrhoea. It can be caused by a number of different viruses, such as rotavirus and norovirus (previously known as Norwalk-like virus). There are many other causes of gastroenteritis including bacteria, toxins, parasites, and some non-infectious diseases.

### **What are the symptoms?**

The main symptoms of viral gastroenteritis are vomiting and watery diarrhoea. Other symptoms may include nausea, fever, abdominal pain, headache, and muscle aches. Dehydration can follow. Symptoms can take between one and three days to develop and usually last between one and two days, sometimes longer.

### **How is it spread?**

Viral gastroenteritis is highly infectious and is spread by the vomit or faeces of an infected person through:

- person-to-person contact, for example shaking hands with someone who has been sick and has the virus on their hands
- contaminated objects
- contaminated food or drink

Infection may also be spread through aerosolised particles when people vomit.

In most cases, spread occurs from a person who has symptoms. Some people can pass on the infection without symptoms, particularly in the first 48 hours after recovery.

### **Who is at risk?**


Viral gastroenteritis can affect people of all ages.

### **How is it prevented?**

After using the toilet, changing nappies, and before eating or preparing food, wash your hands thoroughly with soap and running water for at least 10 seconds and dry them with a clean towel.

### **How is it treated?**

Infants and children attending childcare or school should be excluded from attending for 48 hours after the resolution of symptoms. There is no specific treatment for viral gastroenteritis except rest and drinking plenty of fluids. Most people will recover without complications.




## Woolworths Earn & Learn

## CSEF

### Camps, Sports and Excursion Fund.

If you are on a Health Care Card or Pension Card and the start of the school day date is included before your expiry date, the school is eligible to claim \$125 for each of your children.

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form. If you applied for CSEF in 2018, you do not need to complete an application form in 2019 unless there has been a change in your family circumstances. You only need to complete a form if your child has started, or changed schools in 2019 or you did not apply in 2018 or if there has been a change in family circumstance such as change of name, concession card number or new siblings commencing school in 2019.

**Claims can be made until the end of Term 2.**

Just a reminder to all parents, teachers are on duty and children are supervised from 8.45am so please ensure that your child/children are arriving as close to 8.45am as possible to ensure they are supervised at all times.

This year we will be continuing our focus on student attendance and following up promptly with all parents regarding any unexplained student absences. 
